

SECTION**11.0.0 Relocation of Buildings****11.1.0 Building Moving**

No person or persons shall move any building or structure on any new location on any lot or on or over any public street, sidewalk, alley, or public way without first having obtained a building permit in the normal way. New construction for the new location of the building will comply with all the provisions of the Building, Plumbing, and Electrical Codes of the Village.

11.2.0 Building Movers Bond

Every building mover shall execute a bond to the Village in the penal sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) with good and sufficient sureties, to be approved by the Commissioner of Public Works; conditioned among other things that the contractor shall pay for all damages or injuries to any tree, pavement, street, alley, walk, pole, wire, or other property of said Village or to any person whether said damage or injury be inflicted by said contractor or by his agent or his employee; and keep harmless the Village against all liabilities, judgment, costs and expenses which may in any way accrue against said Village in consequence of the granting of such permit, and that the contractor will strictly comply with the ordinances of said Village and with the conditions of all permits issued under said permit.

11.3.0 Insurance in Lieu of Bond

A liability insurance policy issued and endorsed in the name of the Village by an approved insurance company authorized to do business in the State of Illinois, may be permitted in lieu of bond, under the provisions of this Section of the code, in the amount of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00).

11.4.0 Moving Permits Authorized by the Village Board

The Commissioner of Public Works shall issue no permit for the moving of any building or structure, the extreme height of which exceeds thirty feet (30' 0"), or the extreme width of which exceeds twenty-seven feet (27' 0"), nor for the moving of any building or structure from outside to within the Village without a special resolution of the Village Board authorizing the issuance of such permit.

11.5.0 Permit Fees for Moving Buildings

The fee to be paid to the Village Collector for a permit or structure shall be as provided in Section 6.0, "Permit Fees" and shall be based on the cost of the new construction of placing the moved building or structure into livable or useable condition.

11.6.0 Public Utilities in Relocation of Buildings

The building mover shall make all necessary arrangements with the public utility companies for the relocation or removal of all wires, cables, poles, or other installations or equipment that interfere with the proposed building moving. It shall be unlawful for any building mover to cut, remove, or otherwise interfere with or disturb any wire, cable, pole or other public utility, nor to unreasonably prolong the moving of any building so as to unnecessarily impede or obstruct the use of any public utility or public way, except that crossing of State or County Highways may require a State or County permit. The contractor shall comply with the Electrical Code of the Village in obtaining a bonded, registered, acceptable Electrical Sub-contractor for this work. Also, all plumbing utility work shall be done by a licensed, bonded, plumbing sub-contractor, in accordance with the Plumbing, Sewerage and Heating sections of the Building Code of the Village.
